South Carolina Medicaid by the Numbers

• Full benefit membership: Approximately 1.1 million

Children	690,000
Disabled Adults	130,000
Other Adults	240,000
Elderly	80,000

Data as of Dec. 31, 2020

- Roughly 60% of all children in South Carolina are covered by Medicaid
- In South Carolina, Medicaid covers nearly **60%** of all births
- More than XX% of children and more than 75% of total full benefit members are enrolled in managed care




BabyNet Overview

- Governed by federal law—Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) Part C.
- Provides families with the services and information they need to support their child ages 0-3 with developmental delays or disabilities.
- The BabyNet program is not a Medicaid program, it is a overseen by the Office of Special Education Programs within the U.S. Department of Education.
- SCDHHS assumed lead agency responsibilities July 1, 2017.

BabyNet Program Data

- Referrals received between July 1, 2020- June 7, 2021: 16,937
- 31% increase from SFY2018
- Currently serving 7,534 children with Individualized Family Service Plans (IFSPs)
- Top Referral Sources:
 - ➤ Physicians: 4,975
 - ➤ Child Abuse Prevention & Treatment Act (CAPTA): 4,682
 - ➤ Parent/Relative: 2,675



SCDHHS Pediatric Waiver Enrollment

- Medically Complex Children Waiver
 - Designed to serve children with a serious illness or condition expected to last at least 12 months
 - Dependent upon medications, hospitalizations, skilled nursing services, specialists, and ancillary services
 - Services approved in this waiver are pediatric medical day care and care coordination
 - Children under 21 may also receive Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis, and Treatment services and additional Medicaid State Plan services such as private duty nursing, and/or children's personal care.
- Enrollment has increased to 1,690 for SFY2020 (61% increase from SFY2016)
- Add pediatric enrollment total for other HCBS waivers
