Mental Health Problems Can Exist Early On







Attachment Biobehavioral Catch-Up (ABC)

Addresses three primary issues:

- 1. Young children who have experienced early adversity are especially in need of nurturance.
- Young children who have experienced hardship need parents who follow the lead and delight in them.
- 3. When parents behave in frightening ways, it is difficult for children to look to them for reassurance when distressed.




Circle of Security (COS)

"Simplicity on the other side of complexity"— translating the complicated nature of attachment for parents




The Circle of Security: A Visual "Map" of Caregiver-Child Attachment




